Leadership in Organisations in the Digital World of Work

As the digital age continues to advance relentlessly with the advent of artificial intelligence and robotics, leaders are faced with new and demanding challenges and the uncertainty that derives from continuous technological, ecological and economic disruption. Life and work are becoming more complex with the generational shift and the growth in mental illness in the home and the workplace. The challenge for leaders is to remain grounded while encouraging innovation and experimentation to meet the emerging internal and external environmental demands. Leaders in organisations will no longer be able to survive by adopting a short-term, expediency mindset or by behaving in a narcissistic manner – pursuing their own ends and needs at the expense of everyone else.

2. How do leaders develop these traits?
