

In Aboriginal terminology, Goondeens are men and women respected for their wisdom and experience. Last year, three Queensland Goondeens from very different backgrounds shared their stories for a ground-breaking social history that challenges our established views and asks probing, sometimes uncomfortable questions about what type of country Australia is today, who Australians are as a people, and where we are heading.

Drawing on the book, international management consultant, Bill Synnot, will use the fun format of a quiz (with prizes!) to engage participants in discussion and launch the concept of the 'Goondeen Moment'. He will be joined on the evening by one of the three featured Goondeens, Indigenous Elder and author, Dr Albert Holt. He will also screen short videos to showcase Uncle Albert and his two fellow Goondeens, Everald Compton and Henry Palaszczuk.
